- 1. Network in your community by posting the updated ELF flyer where teachers, health professionals and other community members will see it. Women your chapter has previously sponsored for other P.E.O. grants or scholarships are also potential candidat for an ELF loan if they are continuing their education.
- 2. Work with a local community college, university or junior college through the financia aid office or women's groups on campus.
- 3. Work with other local chapters in the state to coordinate your search for potential applicants. Nebraska's ELF project chair, Kelly Robare, is also a great contact.
- 4. Spread the word at your local chapter events and have copies of the updated ELF flyer available.
- 5. Learn more about ELF by providing information at your local chapter meetings. Check out the updated programs on the ELF website.

 - \$12,000 for associate and bachelor degree programs, technical or professional training and postgraduate certifications
 - \$15,000 for master's degree programs
 - \$20,000 for doctoral degree programs
