Attendance Challenge from Your Organizer

International Chapter's Attendance Challenge is a fun way for local chapters across the Sisterhood to increase attendance at a specific business or social meeting. Your chapter can choose to participate in this activity whenever it works best for you.

1. The goal of this activity is to encourage as many members as possible to attend a designated chapter meeting. The following are suggestions for implementing this activity in your chapter.

2. Set a goal. Ask the treasurer to calculate the average number of sisters who attend chapter meetings. Set an attendance goal of 5% - 10% above that number.

3. Select a date. Look at your chapter meeting schedule. Is there one meeting in December (or other designated month) at which this activity would work best? Consider changing meeting times and/or days to accommodate working members or those who attend school. If your chapter has members with young children, consider hiring a babysitter for the meeting. Brainstorm ways to accommodate those members with transportation problems. Do you have members who are residents of assisted living facilities? Consider helping them host the meeting in their clubhouse or meeting area.

4. Choose a theme. Create enthusiasm for your attendance challenge by setting a theme for the activity. Suggested ideas can be found in the Membership Activities panel of the online Local Chapter Membership Toolbox on the P.E.O. website.

5. Send invitations. To create more excitement, consider sending invitations to all members of your chapter. Don't forget to send them to your nonresident, unaffiliate and inactive* sisters, too. Ask for RSVPs.

6. Follow up. Personally call those members who don't respond. Remind them of your attendance goal and encourage everyone to make every effort to attend.

7. Take a photograph. Is it time for a new chapter photo? This might be a good opportunity to take one. If you decide to take a photograph, be sure to include this information in all pre-meeting publicity.

8. Celebrate your results. Announce your results at the next chapter meeting.

9. Plan next year's activity. Think of how much fun it is to have so many sisters together! What ideas can you generate to make next year's event even more successful?

*Reminder: members with inactive status are ineligible to attend regular or special business meetings; however, they are welcome to attend socials, chapter programs, and other activities.

I BELIEVE that it is within our power as P.E.O.s to help each other, that the rough places may be smooth, and the crooked places straight, the burden less heavy and life a continual joy and blessing, ever increasing, growing richer and richer.

I BELIEVE in the present of our Sisterhood with its opportunities, in the future with its obligations, in the divine joy of living here and thereafter, in the enlarged and ever enlarging

sphere of usefulness that is opening up before us each year."

STAR SCHOLARSHIP TIME! CHAPTERS, IT IS TIME TO GET YOUR NOMINATIONS IN TO INTERNATIONAL FOR THIS SCHOLARSHIP! THE PORTAL OPENS AUGUST 15 AND CLOSES OCTOBER 15. DO NOT PROCRASTINATE! LAST YEAR WE HAD 119 APPLICANTS, LET'S HAVE 130 APPLICANTS THIS YEAR. HERE IS THE INFORMATION FROM INTERNATIONAL... CHAPTER RECOMMENDATION AND APPLICATION PROCESS:

- WHEN A LOCAL CHAPTER IDENTIFIES A PROSPECTIVE APPLICANT, THE LOCAL STAR SCHOLARSHIP CHAIR WILL ARRANGE AN INTERVIEW TO ASSESS ELIGIBILITY. IF THE CHAPTER VOTES TO RECOMMEND THE APPLICANT, THE CHAIR OVERSEES THE ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS.
- THE CHAPTER WILL ADVISE THE APPLICANT THAT SHE WILL BE EMAILED INSTRUCTIONS FOR LOGGING INTO HER ONLINE ACCOUNT TO COMPLETE HER PORTION OF THE APPLICATION. SUBMISSION OF THE CHAPTER RECOMMENDATION FORM MUST BE MADE ONLINE, FOLLOWING THE ONLINE INSTRUCTIONS, BETWEEN AUGUST 15 AND OCTOBER 15.
- THE STUDENT PROFILE, STUDENT ACTIVITY CHARTS, ORIGINAL ONE-PAGE ESSAY, TWO REFERENCES, AND UNOFFICIAL HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT (THROUGH THE 11TH GRADE/JUNIOR YEAR) MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE NO LATER THAN 30 CALENDAR DAYS AFTER THE APPLICANT HAS RECEIVED A LINK WITH LOGIN INFORMATION. CANADIAN APPLICANTS MUST ALSO INCLUDE THEIR PROVINCE CONVERSION GRADING SCALE.

IF you would like to choose a brick with one of four logos (two are star-related; two are daisy-related) you will be allowed 15 spaces for names/words/dates and the cost is \$160 when clip art is used.

Each delegate, after listening to the debate on the floor of convention and taking into consideration all that she has heard, will vote as she sees fit and believes to be in the best interest of the Sisterhood. Please be respectful when contacting a delegate. Her duty to those she represents, Nebraska State Chapter and to the P.E.O. Sisterhood as a whole is to vote in a way that she believes will be for the betterment and success of our beloved organization.
