P.E.O. Project Update from Amy

Every bag of pecans, note card, broom and pin guard sold makes a difference for our projects! This is who we are and what we do. We raise money for the projects so that women might have the opportunity for a higher education to support themselves, their families and their communities.

- STAR Scholarship offers a one-time award of \$2,500 to qualified applicants.
- PCE has a maximum \$4,000 award.
- IPS/Peace Scholarship Fund has a maximum award of \$12,500.
- ELF offers \$12,000 for an associate's degree; \$15,000 for a bachelor's degree; \$20,000 towards a master's degree and \$25,000 towards a doctoral degree.
- Cottey College financial assistance is need based.
- PSA/Scholar Award offers a \$25,000 merit based award toward a doctoral degree.

As of July 2024 ELF has given out \$249.8 million with no payment due until after graduation. Interest is a small 2%.

Hello Sisters, I hope you are enjoying your summer. The Educational Loan Fund has made some changes I want to make sure you are aware of as they will significantly alter the ways we can help women on their educational journey.

New Max Loan Awards & New Indebtedness Limits

Have you heard the exciting news about increased maximum loan awards and increased indebtedness limits for applicants? This information can be found on page 25 of the summer 2024 issue of the P.E.O. Record. These changes were effective July 1, 2024:

Maximum Loan Awards	Indebtedness Limits
• \$12,000 for non-degree* and associate degree	• \$40,000 for non-degree programs*
programs	 \$75,000 for associate degree programs
 \$15,000 for bachelor's degree programs 	 \$100,000 for bachelor's degree programs
 \$20,000 for master's degree programs 	 \$135,000 for master's degree programs
 \$25,000 for Doctoral degree programs 	• \$235,000 for doctoral degree programs

*non-degree programs include trade school, certificate, licensure and endorsement programs In addition, starting July 1, all loans will be disbursed in one installment.

With these changes, the main being the addition of the Associate Degree/Non-Degree addition we will be able to reach and help more women.

Program for Continuing Education

Did you know that the maximum grant is \$4000!? The grant is need based and provides one-time financial assistance to women whose education has been interrupted and who now find it necessary to return to school and complete a degree.

Did you also know that you can sponsor a woman who lives in another community? If you have a friend or a sister who could benefit from a PCE grant and you cannot find a local chapter to sponsor her, your chapter can! The chapter must still conduct an interview. If an in-person interview is not possible, a candidate may also be interviewed by conference call or video call.

Did you know that there is no application deadline? Applications are processed throughout the year. The applicant must be within 18 consecutive months of completing her educational program, so if she has reached that timeframe (or soon will), your chapter may begin the recommendation and application process.

Did you know that your local chapter can be designated a **Brighter Tomorrow Chapter** by giving a gift of \$500 to the Program for Continuing Education? Your contributions of any amount ensure that P.E.O. can continue to help women in need!

Did you know that the answers to all of your PCE questions can be found on the P.E.O. International website? If you can't find what you're looking for, feel free to contact me!

She was embraced and applauded by all attending for her post-doctoral professional accomplishments and her heartfelt appreciation of P.E.O.'s commitment to our educational philanthropies, especially PSA.

Celebrating Past Success—Congratulations to all of the Nebraska chapters who have nominated outstanding scholars in the past, and special congratulations to Chapter DL-Lincoln whose nominee, Amanda Nelson-Lewis, was selected as an alternate for the PSA for the 2024-2025 academic year!

Stepping Up to Success in 2024:

Step One. Do you know an exceptional scholar who is currently within two years of completing her PhD or doctoral-level professional degree? 100 such scholars from the U.S. and Canada will be honored with a \$25,000 P.E.O. Scholar Award in May 2025 for the 2025-2026 academic year! P.E.O. Scholar Awards (PSA) are based on merit and were designed to recognize and encourage academic excellence and achievement by providing partial support for doctoral-level study and research.

Step Two. Online chapter nominations of exceptional scholars must be submitted between August 20, 2024 and November 20, 2024, so NOW is the time to identify and interview potential candidates for these prestigious and highly competitive awards! As you are preparing to speak with potential candidates for a PSA, you will find a wealth of practical resources on the P.E.O. International website to guide you. Remember that your nominees for the P.E.O. Scholar Award can be from Nebraska but working on the dissertation at any accredited university in the U.S. or Canada, or your nominee can be from another state or province, but working on the dissertation at one of the universities in Nebraska.

Step Three. Please feel free to contact me at any time if you have questions or concerns about your potential candidate's eligibility, your chapter letter of nomination, or the information on the P.E.O. International website.

STAR: Chapter recommendation must be submitted between Aug. 15 and Oct. 15. Applicant has 30 days after receiving application link.
