A CIC delegate needs to have attended a state convention as a delegate, either the upcoming convention or a previous one.

EDUCATIONAL LOAN FUND

• Loans approved will not exceed the amount recommended by the sponsoring chapter. • Monies received from the Educational Loan Fund shall not be used for debt reduction (educational, personal, etc.). • Loans must be repaid in the same currency in which they were issued. • The local chapter is recognized as a Legacy Chapter for making a lump-sum contribution of \$500 or more.



INTERNATIONAL PEACE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Named scholarships are available with the receipt of donations equal to the scholarship amount. • The local chapter is recognized as a Partners in Peace Chapter and partnered with an IPS recipient for making a lump-sum contribution of \$500 or more. Partners in Peace is limited to single chapters; a gift of at least \$500 must be sent with the Partners in Peace Form by the deadline to be designated as a Partners in Peace Chapter.



PROGRAM FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION

- Named grants are available with the receipt of lump-sum donations equaling \$4,000.
 Endowed awards are available when earnings on an endowment equal the award amount.
- The local chapter is recognized as a Brighter Tomorrow Chapter for making a lump-sum contribution of \$500 or more.



SCHOLAR AWARDS

- Named awards are available with the receipt of donations equaling the award amount.
 Endowed awards are available when earnings on an endowment equal the award amount.
- The local chapter is designated as a Laureate Chapter for making a lumpsum contribution of \$500 or more.
