



- ✓ Contact Kellie Stang ASAP indicating your interest in being a candidate for the executive board and she will send application materials to you.
- ✓ Complete an inventory of skills, experience, etc., the chapter letter of support, and submit all to Kellie Stang no later than **Saturday, November 1, 2025.**
- ✓ Interviews will take place, likely via Zoom, in mid-November, if possible.
- \checkmark Decision made and applicants notified by no later than February 28th, 2025.

Program for Continuing Education



As the new school year is

starting, it is time to look around to see if you know of anyone that can be considered for a Program for Continuing Education grant. As a reminder, the eligibility requirements are:

- the recipient needs to have had at least 24 consecutive months as a non-student sometime in her adult life
- is within 18 consecutive months of completing her educational program
- the enrolled program, when completed, will lead to employment or job advancement
- has not already earned a master's degree or above.

For women looking for a Spring 2026 grant (January 2026 Term Start):

- Anticipated graduation date before June 30, 2027
- Chapter recommendation window is between 8 and 14 weeks prior to

start of the term/semester.

• This translates to basically the month of October 2025 for Chapter recommendation submissions.

Start looking now so your chapter is ready when that submission window opens.

STAR Scholarship time is here!! August is the time to start the STAR Scholarship nomination process. The

nomination form is on the P.E.O. website, and it is easy to access. Be aware that there have been a few small improvements and changes in the form this year. Please read over the nomination form before you begin.

The forms must be submitted no later than October 15, 2025, but will not be accepted before August 15, 2025. Once your submission has been accepted by the notice from the P.E.O. office, please inform your nominee and your chapter.

If your nominee has already begun the submittal, please be aware there have been recent refinements. There still is adequate time to complete the submittal with any corrections.

This year recommendation letters will be filed in support of your nominee by uploading the document rather than by an email process. There are resources and instructions available for the submission of these support letters.

It is always a good idea to check with your nominee to offer help, remind them of deadlines, and give them encouragement. A senior year is always full of deadlines, activities, and stress.

Educational Loan Fund

The Educational Loan Fund has made some changes I want to make sure you are aware of as they will significantly alter the ways we can help women on their educational journey.

New Max Loan Awards & New Indebtedness Limits
As a review, the new increased maximum loan awards and increased indebtedness limits for applicants are as follows:

Maximum Loan Awards	Indebtedness Limits	
\$12,000 for non-degree	\$40,000 for non-degree	
& associate degree	programs	
programs	\$75,000 for associate

\$15,000 for bachelor's	\$100,000 for bachelor's

In addition, all loans will be disbursed in one installment. With these changes, the main being the addition of the Associate Degree/non-Degree addition we will be able to reach and help more women. P.E.O. Scholar Awards

As summer begins to wind down and we head into the beginning of another school year it is time again to think about women who are looking for financial assistance to pursue

their educational goals. The Scholar Award is an exciting opportunity for women pursuing doctoral-level programs. As a reminder, the Scholar Award is a one-time, competitive, merit-based award intended to recognize and encourage academic excellence and achievement by women in doctoral-level programs.

It should be noted that the online application for the Scholar Award is available every year from August 20th to November 20th. So, if you have a woman you are interested in nominating, now is the time to get all

the information lined up and be ready to fill out the online nomination form starting after August 20th.

The online nomination form and submission instructions are available on the P.E.O. International member website (www.peointernational.org) as is a wealth of information around the Scholar Award for chapters and the women we nominate.

Wondering how to find women who would be eligible for the Scholar Award? Establishing contact with faculty in top graduate programs is a great way to find candidates for the prestigious P.E.O. Scholar Award. Is your chapter in a town that has a collegiate program for doctoral studies? Think about finding ways to connect with the women in those programs. Once you have researched the institution and reviewed Scholar Award eligibility requirements, contact department chairs or deans of doctoral programs to inform them about the P.E.O Scholar Awards and ask for referrals of their top women doctoral candidates. The further along a woman is in her program, the better her chances are for selection.
